## GRADE REPORTS

Grades will be mailed home at the end of each 6-week grading period. The first and second reports for each semester are progress grades in all courses. Only semester grades issued in January and June are final grades and become part of the student’s transcript or permanent record. Grades should arrive home a week or so after:

## CITIZENSHIP MARKS

Citizenship is indicated on the student report cards to inform parents, however, these marks are not a part of the student’s transcript or permanent record. Citizenship marks are defined as:

O = Outstanding

N = Needs to Improve

S = Satisfactory

U = Unsatisfactory

## REPEATING A COURSE

Please consult the course description catalog to determine whether a course may be repeated for credit. Make-up classes must be completed in after school programs (Bulldog Learning Center and/or Adult Ed). All courses must be approved by your counselor or administrator ahead of time prior to taking the course.

## HIGH SCHOOL EXIT EXAM

Current law requires students to pass an examination in language arts and mathematics in accordance with the statewide academically rigorous content standards adopted by the State Board of Education. Students are allowed to test once during their sophomore year, twice during the junior year and five times during their senior year in order to qualify for a high school diploma.

## HOMEWORK

The WCHS Instructional Staff considers homework to be an important educational tool. Students, particularly those with postgraduate plans that include college attendance, should develop a systematic plan for out-of-school study. WCUSD policy recommends 30 minutes of homework for each hour of regular core (math, science, history, language arts) class time to strengthen reading, writing, and study skills. In general, homework will be assigned for the following reasons:

- 1.) To provide additional practice and/or further study in materials and subjects which have been previously introduced in class.
- 2.) To allow students to make up work which has been missed due to absence (illness, field trips, etc.)

- 3.) To acquire additional information from home and/or community sources as may be available.
- 4.) To develop study habits and the ability to organize and complete assigned homework tasks.

### **TEACHER CONFERENCES**

Appointments for parent-student-teacher conferences may be scheduled through the counseling office. In order to protect instructional time, calls are never placed directly through to a teacher's classroom during class time. Additionally, each teacher may be reached through the school's e-mail system accessible through our school web Page: <http://wchs-wcusd-ca.schoolloop.com>

### **PROGRAM CHANGES**

Students enrolled in classes that are one year in duration are expected to remain in them for the entire year. If the student and parent feel a change is necessary, the student's teacher and/or counselor should be involved in that decision. A Change of Program form must be completed and signed by all parties involved. The counselor will ultimately review the request and make the final decision. After the fifth week of the semester, any dropped course will result in a "Withdrawal - F" for that course being recorded on the permanent record. In most cases, it will not be possible to add another class in place of the one dropped.

### **GRADE POINT AVERAGES**

Grade point average is calculated by multiplying credits by grade points earned for each grade in each course. Add the results for all courses then divide by the number of credits attempted.

#### Non-Weighted

- A = 4 Grade points
- B = 3 Grade points
- C = 2 Grade points
- D = 1 Grade point
- F = 0 Grade points

#### Weighted

- 5 points in Honors and Advanced Placement
- 4 points in Honors and Advanced Placement
- 3 points in Honors and Advanced Placement
- Grades of "D" earned in honors and AP are not assigned extra points.
- Not all Honors courses are weighted.

### **ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSES**

West Covina High School offers 21 Advanced Placement courses in the areas of math, science, social science, English, foreign language, fine arts, and computer science. Advanced Placement courses are college level courses for which you may receive college credit upon passing the Advanced Placement test with a qualifying score. Entrance requirements are different for each exam and the course offering book lists requirements and/or qualifying exams needed for classes.

## RENAISSANCE PROGRAM

Renaissance is a leadership and recognition program that provides students with tangible incentives, rewarding superior achievement, effort and attendance with discounts at local businesses. All students are encouraged to earn and apply for Renaissance membership. Membership entitles students to carry the Renaissance card, to wear the T-shirt, which identifies them as successful students, and to attend each semester's Renaissance assembly in which students and their classroom successes are recognized.

## WHAT IS ASB?

All WCHS enrolled students are automatically members of the **Associated Student Body** or ASB. All students are governed by the ASB constitution and have the opportunity to elect officers to the ASB Cabinet. Many students purchase and carry ASB Cards and therefore are extended special privileges.

## ASB CARDS

The purchase of an ASB (Associated Student Body) Card turns your ID card into a savings card. Students holding an ASB card receive reduced rates for athletic events, discounts on all dances and formals, free activity and athletic letters, full privileges in the Renaissance Program (when academic requirements are met), as well as numerous other perks and incentives throughout the school year. **The cost of an ASB Card is \$35.00.** Typically, student savings may range from \$60.00 to \$100.00, depending upon involvement in activities and athletic events. ASB Cards are non-transferable and non-refundable, and at no time shall a student lend his/her card to another student. If caught, the card will be forfeited for the year.

***Any student experiencing difficulty with the purchase of an ASB Card is encouraged to speak with the ASB Advisor to arrange a monthly payment plan.***

## **ELIGIBILITY FOR PARTICIPATION IN EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES**

In order to be eligible to participate in extra/co-curricular activities, a student must have earned a minimum 2.0 or "C" unweighted grade point average during the preceding grading period. Grading periods as designated on the Calendar at 6-week intervals. In addition, to be eligible, a student must maintain minimum progress toward meeting high school graduation requirements.

## **ACADEMIC INELIGIBILITY**

The academic ineligibility list is compiled every six weeks, after each 6-week and 12-week progress report and after the final semester grades. If any student has earned an unweighted grade point average below 2.0 or has not passed at least four classes in any grading period, he/she is automatically placed on this list. The purpose of the ineligibility list is to ensure that students who are participating in extra-curricular activities are also achieving success academically.

Students are ineligible for the entire grading period and are never removed from the list during that same grading period. Students on the academic ineligibility list are not allowed to participate in any form of extra-curricular activity, including but not limited to practices, games, rehearsals, try-outs or ASB. The only way to become eligible for extra-curricular activities again is to earn a 2.0 unweighted GPA or better and pass at least four classes at the next grading period.

West Covina Unified School District policy, as well as the California Interscholastic Federation (CIF) Guidelines, lists requirements for active participation in any co-curricular or extra-curricular activity. Students **must maintain at least an unweighted 2.0 GPA** to participate under both organizations. WCUSD has an additional requirement that the participating students must **have no more than one Unsatisfactory mark in citizenship during any one grading period**. These guidelines affect participation in (but are not limited to) the following: Band, Choral Music, Colorguard, Dance Court Members, Drill Team, Pep Squad, all Team Sports, Clubs, ASB and Class Officers. Please refer to the WCHS probation policy on the WCHS website for additional information.

## **WEST COVINA HIGH SCHOOL**

Whereas: high ethical and moral behavior in education is essential; and individual students are responsible for their own work and actions; and the individual, school, and society benefit greatly from the maintenance of high standards; and the integrity of fair academic competition shall not be abridged; then, be it known that the following are some of the major points of the WCHS Honor Code posted on the school website:

## **ACADEMIC CODE OF HONOR**

Is in effect at West Covina High School

1. The students shall use only those accessory examination materials allowed by the teacher.
2. The student shall solicit and use only examination information made available to all students by the teacher.
3. The student shall respect another student's right to privacy of materials, tests, etc.
4. The student shall behave in an honorable way, so as not to assume an unfair advantage over fellow students.
5. The students, when doing research assignments, shall give proper credit (i.e., footnotes and/or bibliography in compliance with teacher instructions) to those sources used in order to avoid plagiarism.
6. The student shall be responsible for his/her own homework.
7. The student shall offer and receive from other students only that information which is approved by the teacher.
8. The student shall respect the rights of privacy, property, free expression, and the dignity and integrity of other students, teachers and support staff.

In order to maintain the integrity of the school and its individuals, violations of this Code will result in appropriate action being taken by school personnel.

## CODE OF CONDUCT:

It is recognized that WCHS students who participate in athletics, performing arts, or student government are in the public eye as highly visible representatives of this high school. It is vital that their representation accurately communicates the high standards and values that the school promotes. Consequently, students who perform in the public eye are expected to make sure that their behavior does not discredit themselves, their family, their organization or their school. Unacceptable behavior includes, but is not limited to, verbal or physical abuse and all forms of disrespect for any individual, thievery, acts of vandalism, or involvement with illegal narcotics, alcohol, or tobacco. It is also expected that students attend classes on those days in which he/she participates in athletic, performing, government, or other student activities. Violations of these expectations may cause disciplinary action in accordance with school policy, and may, affect their eligibility to continue in the role as school representative.

## STUDENT GOVERNMENT

Effective student leadership is the essential ingredient of a successful school. Its purpose is to organize and economically support activities and athletics, to promote school spirit, deal with issues affecting students, to act as a liaison between the student body and administration, and to make and interpret student activity policy for the benefit of the entire student body. The ASB Constitution and By Laws exist for the student House of Representatives and Inter-Club Council to help advise the officers of the ASB Cabinet in the democratic process.

**ASB Cabinet:** The upper legislative house, or ASB Cabinet, is comprised of 7 elected officials, 2 representatives each from the senior, junior, sophomore and freshman classes, and 16 additional appointed members of the cabinet. The ASB President officially presides over Cabinet Meetings once weekly for the approval of all fundraisers, expenditures, and activities. Elections for ASB and Class officers are held in the spring and nominees must have a 2.5 total weighted GPA with no F's and no more than one N and NO U's in citizenship in the preceding semester. Once elected, class presidents and vice presidents, must enroll in the ASB Leadership class. Elective credit is given for this class. Appointed members of cabinet must have a 2.0 total weighted GPA and undergo an interview process by elected officers prior to selection in the spring.

**House of Representatives:** Members of the lower legislative house or House of Representatives are elected each fall by **4th period classes** to meet once a month all year. The role of each representative is to provide feedback to the ASB Cabinet on issues that affect the entire student body. The person representing each 4th period class should inform students about a particular issue and then garner gather responses and report the findings back to ASB. That person should be articulate, outspoken, and responsible, possess natural leadership skills, and be trusted representatives who have a desire to represent their peers.

**Inter-Club Council:** Club representatives are required to meet monthly for discussions and training on effective club management and financial practices.

**School Site Council:** Student representatives from each graduating class, usually the vice presidents, are required to meet monthly with representatives of the faculty, staff, and community to discuss funding priorities through the School Improvement Program.

## GRADUATING CLASS CLUB MEMBERSHIP

Each grade level elects officers who plan special activities and fund raising events for the class and/or school. Class officers work with the class advisor. Every student is eligible to plan with the officers and advisor, help with fund raising and help raise class spirit. Meeting times and locations for Class meetings are announced during the morning announcements. You are invited to attend and help make your class the best!

## **DAILY ANNOUNCEMENTS**

Notices are not to exceed 50 words, must be submitted to the ASB office by the end of lunch the day before they are intended for announcing, and they must include an advisor's signature for approval.

## **POSTERS AND FLIERS**

**All posters and fliers to be displayed on campus must be approved by ASB or Administration and feature a stamp of approval.** No items are to be hung up on **maroon painted** surfaces, doors, poles, or lockers. Posters and fliers that fall off the walls will be discarded. All posters and fliers will be removed before the weekend, unless affixed to official bulletin boards.

## **FUNDRAISING ACTIVITIES**

Individuals may not sell items on campus to the student body. Fund raising projects both on and off campus by WCHS clubs and organizations must be approved by the ASB Cabinet through submission of a "Request for Fund Raising Form." See the Club Handbook for details. Tight controls regulate the frequency and duration of fund raising, as well as the accounting of funds each day at the ASB office. All club officers and advisors should undergo periodic training by ASB to remain in compliance with district and state policies.

### Requirements for Athletics:

WCHS offers a variety of competitive events and team sports. Student athletes must:

- 1.) Complete a physical examination
- 2.) Have private health coverage or purchase coverage through the school,
- 3.) Submit a written parent consent/ medical release agreement,
- 4.) Maintain a 2.0 unweighted GPA throughout the season,
- 5.) Receive no more than one (1) U in Citizenship.

### LETTERING POLICIES

Each student may earn one Athletics, one Activities Letter, and one Academic Lamp through commitment to academic and extracurricular programs throughout their four years at WCHS. **Students may only receive these awards free of charge if they are ASB Cardholders. If a student is eligible for a letter and does not hold an ASB Card the student may purchase their letter for \$25.00 and emblems for \$15.00 each.** Lost letters can also be replaced for \$25.00 and lost emblems for \$15.00 In addition, the student must be academically eligible for two grading periods during season, and their names are presented by their coach/advisor to the ASB Office in conjunction with a previously published Lettering Policy.

**Athletics:** Students who participate for the complete season on the Varsity Team achieve a Maroon Letter and Swiss Inserts for each sport. Students who have lettered previously receive a bar.

**League Champions and CIF Champions** receive patches.

**Scholar Athlete Patches** (small lamp for each additional sport as well as each additional year/season) are awarded to varsity students who achieve a 3.5 GPA during all grading periods that occur during the season.

**4 Year Lettermen** receive special patches as do **Tri-Sport Athletes**.

**Fine Arts:** Students who perform for the complete season in Drama, Choir, Band, Color Guard, Dance/Drill are eligible to achieve a Gold Letter and Swiss Inserts for each performing group. Students who have lettered previously receive a bar.

**Scholar Performer Patches** are awarded to students who achieve a 3.5 GPA during entire year they were in a performing group. (small lamp for each additional year )

**Clubs and Organizations:** Students who remain active all year with clubs and follow specific rigorous requirements set forth by each club are eligible to achieve a Gold Letter and emblems for each organization. Students who have lettered previously receive a bar

**Academic:** Students who are on the Principal's Honor Roll for two consecutive semesters earn an Academic Lamp. For three consecutive semesters or more, students will receive a bar.

# **GENERAL STUDENT INFORMATION**

## **ATTENDANCE**

Students arriving late or leaving early **MUST SIGN IN OR OUT** at the Attendance Office. A parent must call **BEFORE** the student arrives or send a note with the student in order to have their absence or tardy cleared.

Any period missed due to late arrival without a parent note or phone call the next morning (by 9:00 am) will be classified as a truant. The consequence for truants include the loss of opportunity to make up work in class and the assignment of detentions. If late arrival is cleared by parents after 9:00 am the following morning, truants will be cleared with teachers, yet detentions will stand as scheduled.

Parents of students who are absent are requested to telephone the Attendance Office to clear the absence for each day of the student's absence. To assist in this process, you may leave messages 24 hours a day. Phone # 626-859-2900 x2917

If phone contact does not occur, students must drop off a note from the parents verifying the cause of absence to the Attendance Office. An absence, which has not been cleared within three days, will be classified as truancy. The consequence for truancies includes the loss of opportunity to make up instruction missed for the unexcused absence and the issuing of detentions. In most cases, two Saturday Schools will be issued for a full day absence (6 hours). In addition, if the parent clears the absence outside the three-day limit, the truancy will be cleared with teachers, yet detentions or Saturday Schools will stand as scheduled.

Upon returning to school, students report directly to class – they do not report first to the Attendance Office (except when dropping off a note) since they have already been cleared. They will not require a "re-admit" slip.

Students are expected to report on time to all of their classes. Attendance will be taken each period. Excessive absences usually lead to poor learning. The instructor may refer a student to their Dean for appropriate action. A student's absence will be recorded regardless of the reason for the absence.

### **ATTENDANCE PROCEDURES (CLEARING AN ABSENCE)**

Each student has three school days to clear an all-day absence. **If he/she fails to do so, the absence is classified as a truancy. If the student is tardy to class, it is considered a truant. Make-up work/tests may not be given. Each student has one day to clear a single period absence. For more information on tardy and truancy policies, see the Student Behavior Guidelines.**

### **BICYCLES AND SKATEBOARDS**

Students are not to ride bicycles or skateboards on campus at any time. They are to be brought onto campus from the front gate only. Please walk with them from the public sidewalk to the rack area behind the ASB Building. Racks are provided to park and lock all bicycles and skateboards. Bicycles and skateboards will be confiscated, if they are found outside of these designated areas or if students are discovered riding them, until parents come to claim them.

### **CAREER TESTING**

Several interest inventories and aptitude batteries are available to students. All 9th grade students will take the Bridges interest inventory in their computer lit class. The inventory can be saved online in the student's portfolio.

### **COLLEGE/CAREER CENTER**

The College and Career Center, located behind the Media Center, serves as a doorway to college admissions and career pathways. Students can access college information via the Internet using the Choices Program. Books are available to help students prepare for the ACT, SAT, and AP tests. There is also a wide assortment of college catalogs. Financial aid and military information are also found in the Career Center. The Career Center is open from 7:30 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. daily. There is a College Advisor, Career Center Specialist, and an ROP Counselor in the Career Center to assist students and parents.

The Choices Program is available online at [www.bridges.com](http://www.bridges.com). Students can create a portfolio and access it from anywhere they have an internet connection. The site ID is 1000173 and the password is westcovina. The ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) test is given to interested juniors and seniors in December.

The College/Career Center is available and used by students, parents and staff. Services include:

**Students wanting work permits must have a "C" (2.0) unweighted GPA and good attendance at school.**

Students and parents are encouraged to take advantage of the many services and opportunities available. All activities and events are posted on the school website and announced in the Daily Bulletin, and the College & Career Center Bulletin.

### **CHANGE OF ADDRESS**

Students are responsible for keeping the school informed of any changes of address or phone number that can be used in case of emergency.

### **CLEARING THE CAMPUS**

Students are expected to leave campus after the end of their regular school day unless they are involved in a scheduled extra-curricular activity. Students will not be allowed to loiter on campus after their school day ends.

### **CLOSED CAMPUS**

West Covina High School is a “closed campus.” This means that all students are required to stay on campus from the beginning of their daily schedule of classes through the end of their scheduled classes, including the nutrition and lunch periods. Students are reminded that they are under the school’s jurisdiction any time they are on our campus or any other WCUSD campus. A 40 minute lunch period will be made available every day, except when “minimum days” are designated. A 10 minute nutrition period will be made available, except when cancelled for special activities. Students who have medical, dental, or other scheduled appointments off campus must bring a note signed by a parent or legal guardian in advance to the Attendance Office where a written authorization to leave campus will be issued. Students who arrive at school any time after the beginning of their first scheduled class of the day must report first to the Attendance Office for a pass.

No student is to leave the campus at any time during school hours—for any reason—except by pass from Attendance, Health, or R.O.P. offices. All visitors must receive permission to be on campus and secure a pass from the receptionist at the front office. Students may earn the privilege for an **off-campus lunch** pass. An individual student’s GPA and STAR test results determine this privilege.

### **COMPUTER USE**

Computers are provided for educational purposes only. Students may access the Internet only if they and their parents have signed the Internet Use Agreement for that school year. Students may not use computers or the Internet for chatting, purchases, profit, fraud or vandalism. Communication over the Internet with other people in the form of e-mail or bulleting boards will only be permitted under a staff member’s supervision.

### **DAMAGE, THEFT & VANDALISM**

#### **CARE OF SCHOOL AND PERSONAL PROPERTY**

Students are responsible for the care of all books, supplies and furniture supplied by the school. Students who damage or deface school property will be required to pay for the damage. Students should limit items brought to school to those items necessary for school activities. The school is not responsible for items brought to school, which are lost or stolen. Report any thefts to the Dean’s Office.

### **ELECTRONIC DEVICES**

Electronic devices including iPod, MP3 player, PSP, CD players, headphones, radios or walkie-talkies are only allowed during lunch and nutrition. Some pagers are permitted for medical reasons. These reasons must be cleared in advance through the Dean’s Office. Cellular phones and pagers are not to be used during the school day or passing periods. They are to be kept silent and out of sight so as not to be disruptive to the learning environment (EC 48901.5) **If cell phones/pagers are detected they will be confiscated and turned over to the Deans’ Office. Parents or legal guardian must pick up confiscated items. Items not recovered within a reasonable period time will be discarded. West Covina High School is not liable for damage or loss to confiscated items and is not responsible for any stolen items. The primary objective of requiring students not to bring restricted materials to school is to ensure students’ focus on educational tasks, student’s safety and to prevent the loss or damage of private property.**

### **FEES**

Fees for lost or overdue books must be paid before students are cleared for graduation or admission to fall classes. Fees are paid at the ASB office. **ASB accepts no checks past April--Cash Only. Payment plans available upon need.**

### **FIELD TRIPS**

Each student must get clearance from each teacher on a blue card before attending an all-day field trip. In addition, a parent signature must be on file granting permission for all off-campus activities.

## **FOOD SERVICES**

A selection of sandwiches, salads, fresh fruit, chips, and beverages is available from locations throughout the quad and cafeteria building during lunch. Snacks are available from the cafeteria during the nutrition recess. Applications for **free or reduced breakfast/lunch** may be picked up in the cafeteria office. Students may eat lunch throughout the quad, but no food or drink is allowed in any classroom. Wherever students choose to eat, they are expected to show pride in WCHS by keeping the area free of trash.

## **HALLWAYS AND HALL PASSES**

During class all hallways should remain empty. Students excused from a classroom while classes are in session must carry Hall Passes. WCHS uses a standardized pass system. While using the hallways during class, students are expected to maintain an academic learning environment by **not** running, yelling, using profane language, or making excessive noise.

## **IDENTIFICATION CARDS**

All students are given a current WCHS ID card upon registration. Every student must carry his/her current ID at all dances. As the name indicates, the card is used for identification of the holder. No library services or business transactions will be provided to any student not presenting their I.D. card. These cards are provided free of charge; pictures are taken during registration. It is each student's responsibility to make sure his/her ID picture has been taken during registration. Students new to the school or anyone who loses his/her card must go to the ASB office to make arrangements for their card. **Replacement ID cards are issued at a charge of \$5.00 on Thursdays every week.** These ID cards are also used in the cafeteria.

## **INTERNET USAGE AGREEMENT**

All students must have a WCUSD Internet Acceptable Use Policy Release (Form 7007) on file with the Media Center to use school computers in our labs. Juniors and seniors enrolled at the Academy campus need an additional signed release on file at the Academy campus for an Internet access account.

## **LOCKERS**

A limited number of lockers are available for the safekeeping of books and other student property needed at school. Do not plan on having a locker. WCHS accepts no responsibility for vandalism or lost articles. Students are encouraged to remove all items from their lockers at the end of each school day and weekends because of the threat of locker vandalism and theft. The school reserves the right to search lockers at any time in the interest of a safe and orderly school operation.

## **LOST AND FOUND**

If clothing, books, backpacks or notebooks have been lost, check first in the Media Center. The Media Center staff maintains a Lost and Found cabinet.

## **MAKE-UP WORK**

If a student is ill or unable to attend school, the parent should call the counseling office to inquire about make-up work. Usually, make-up assignments can be collected from teachers and the parent may stop by the school to pick them up within 48 hours.

## **MEDIA CENTER**

The Media Center maintains a study hall atmosphere throughout the school day and after school. Many services are available and the staff is there to assist students with academic needs. The computers are available whenever teachers have not reserved them for use during their classes. Library books are available for circulation to students with an I.D. card. Students are financially responsible for all items including textbooks that are checked out. Unpaid fees, damages and losses may result in the student not participating in graduation ceremonies.

## **MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS**

If parents need their student to leave school for an appointment or other preplanned commitments, a phone call to the attendance office should be placed before the time the student leaves. When the parent arrives to pick up the student, the parent should report to the attendance office and the student will be called from class. Upon returning from an appointment, the student should report to the attendance office before going back to class. If a student leaves school without getting clearance through the office, that student is marked truant.

## **MEDICATION**

By law, any medication that is to be taken while in school must be stored and administered in the Health Office, where the Health clerk can verify it has been prescribed. Staff may not dispense medication, including aspirin.

## **MESSAGES AND DELIVERIES**

Messages delivered to students during class time are limited to official school business and urgent parent communication as relayed through the attendance office. We encourage students not to have items delivered. The delivery of balloons or flowers to students during the school day is prohibited as it can disrupt the learning environment. All deliveries will be kept at the front office for the student to pick up at the end of the day.

## **NEWSPAPER**

The school newspaper, **NewsBytes**, provides students with bi-monthly information about activities and events around the campus. This paper is provided free for all students

## **PARKING PASSES**

Student parking is located at the "Tennis Court Parking Lot." All other campus parking lots are designated faculty parking or visitor parking. Students must have proof of current car insurance on file with the ASB Office to obtain parking permits for both our main campus and the academy campus. Parking permits must be on display at all times within the student vehicle or cars will be cited. Students are not to use their cars as lockers. Once the car is parked for the day, access is restricted to secure each parking lot.

## **RALLIES AND ASSEMBLIES**

Although there are a number of optional lunch-time rallies planned throughout the year to generate school spirit, publicize our athletic programs, and showcase our performing groups, ASB also plans numerous all school assemblies. Teachers will be given notice of assemblies (held in the gym) several weeks in advance in order to plan accordingly.

## **STUDENT DROP-OFF**

Student pick-up and drop-off zones are located along Fernwood and Cameron Avenue before and after school. During school hours, however, all gates are locked and student access is restricted. Please inform parents to use only the visitor parking area near the administration building for late drop-offs.

## **STUDENT STORE**

Open during nutrition, lunch and after school, our student store provides snacks, drinks, ice cream, PE uniforms, school supplies, spirit items and spirit wear. The student store is located in the ASB Building near the center of the quad. Tickets to many events are sold through the ASB windows during lunch. Dance tickets must be bought with **current SCHOOL ID and CASH ONLY. All profits from the Student Store and the vending machines on campus help to support our student activities and athletic programs. Starting in April the ASB Student Store will accept---Cash Only. Seniors must make all of the senior event purchases with CASH ONLY. NO REFUNDS are made on any purchases from the Student Store.**

## **TEXTBOOKS**

Students are responsible for textbooks that are issued to them. It is the student's duty to put a book cover on each textbook and maintain it in good condition. Free book covers are often available from the Media Center. Charges will be levied for lost or damaged books. When a student withdraws from a class, textbooks must be returned to the Media Center. Students are encouraged to keep a log of the barcodes for the books they have checked out.

## **VISITOR PARKING**

Limited parking spaces are available for short-term parking. These spaces are located in the Fernwood lot in front of the Administration Building. Please do not park in any space designated for school personnel. Remember that all visitors to WCHS must check in at the front office.

## **YEARBOOKS**

The WCHS yearbook, produced by the **Quest Club**, provides students with a photographic record of memorable events from the school year. The yearbook may be purchased along with an ASB card in the beginning of the school year for a special reduced rate. The price of the book increases through the year. Yearbooks are sold at the Student Store windows.

# **STUDENT BEHAVIOR GUIDELINES**

## **RESPECT FOR THE RIGHTS OF OTHERS**

Every right that we have is attached to an obligation. Your rights must be balanced against the rights of others, and their rights must be balanced against yours. Also, the purpose of the school and the requirements of the educational process must be weighed in deciding who has a right to do what and which behavior needs to be corrected. That is why our society has laws and why a school has rules. If you wish to take full advantage of your rights, while still respecting the rights of others, we at WCHS will support you.

## **STUDENT DUTIES**

Every student shall attend school punctually and regularly, conform to the regulations of the school; obey promptly all the directions of his/her teacher and others in authority; observe good order and propriety of deportment; be diligent in study; respectful to his/her teacher and others in authority; kind and courteous to school mates; and refrain from the use of vulgar or profane language. (CCR Title 5 300)

## **WEST COVINA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD POLICY**

**District programs and activities shall be free from unlawful discrimination, including harassment, with respect to ethnic group, religion, gender, color, race, national origin, sexual orientation, and physical or mental disability.**

## **NON-DISCRIMINATION POLICY**

The Governing Board is committed to equal opportunity for all individuals in education. District programs and activities shall be free from discrimination based on sex, sexual orientation, race, color, religion, national origin, ethnic group, marital or parental status, physical or mental disability or any other unlawful consideration. The Board shall promote programs to ensure discriminatory practices are eliminated in all district activities. No student shall, on the basis of sex, race or religious preference, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any education program or activity provided by any school in the West Covina Unified School District.

## **SEXUAL HARASSMENT**

The Board of Education is committed to maintain an employment and educational environment free from sexual harassment for its employees and students. The Board of Education considers sexual harassment a violation of state and federal laws which may result in disciplinary action or dismissal of the offending employee or in the case of students, suspension or expulsion as provided by Board Policy 5114, Suspension, Expulsion, Exemption or Exclusion of Students. Sexual harassment means unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, and other verbal, visual or physical conduct of a sexual nature, made by someone from or in the work or education setting, under any of the following conditions:

- a) Submission to the conduct is explicitly or implicitly made a term or a condition of an individual's employment, status, progress or promotion.
- b) Submission to, or rejection of, the conduct by the individual is used as the basis of employment or academic decisions affecting the individual.
- c) The conduct has the purpose or effect of having a negative impact upon the individual's work or academic performance, or of creating an intimidating, hostile, or offensive work or educational environment, or
- d) Submission to, or rejection of, the conduct by the individual is used as the basis for any decision affecting the individual regarding benefits, services, honor, programs or activities.

It shall be the policy of this District to investigate and remedy in an expeditious and timely manner any reports of sexual harassment. All employees and students are encouraged to report incidents of sexual harassment without fear of reprisal. Student reports may be made to the Principal, Administrator or designee of the school in which he or she is in attendance, or to the Director of Pupil Services at the District Office. (*Education Codes: 212.5, 212.6, 48900.2, 48915*)

## **TRUANCY POLICY: CONSEQUENCES FOR FAILING TO CLEAR ABSENCES**

Each student has three school days to clear an all-day absence. If he/she fails to do so, the absence will become a truancy. Truancies cannot be cleared and make-up work/tests may not be given. Each student has one day to clear a single period absence.

In order to adjust the permanent record containing full day truancies, West Covina High School offers a **Make-Up Program** (offered on Saturday and during the week), which is served on campus. This adjusts the truancy on the record to reflect that the missed school hours have been made up.

Any three full day truancies, which have not been made up, may prevent participation in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. **Students involved in dance, sports, music, drama, etc. may not be given a release to participate until these truancies have been made up.** Students may not be allowed to purchase tickets to dances and other activities until their attendance is cleared, as well. Seniors may also specifically lose privileges with regards to graduation activities.

### **FORGING**

Forging parent correspondence is a violation of California State law and subject to disciplinary action, which may include detention, Saturday School, community service, or suspension.

### **DRUG/SUBSTANCE-DETECTING CANINES**

In an effort to keep our schools as safe learning environments, the West Covina Unified School District will periodically enlist the used of substance sniffing canines on our campuses. These dogs are never in contact with students and are trained to detect various illegal substances. Offenses involving possession or sale of drugs, alcohol, or dangerous objects, and/or assault with a dangerous object will be reported to the proper legal authorities.

### **BREAK AND LUNCH TARDINESS**

All students tardy to class after each period, break and lunch, will be sent to the center quad to receive one of two options: **Ecology Club Service** or an **After-School Detention**. After the consequence is given, students will return to class. Tardies to the first period of the day will be handled differently and will include direct instruction regarding punctuality, academics, and intervention.

### **LOITERING ON-CAMPUS AFTER SCHOOL**

Unless students are enrolled in tutoring, 8th period classes or specific extracurricular programs, they are expected to leave campus immediately after their last class period. WCHS does not provide supervision of students after school, and will ask any student remaining on campus to exit.

### **CURFEW**

No person under the age of 18 shall loiter about public places after 10:00 p.m. or before sunrise.

### **STUDENT DRESS AND GROOMING STANDARDS**

Students' dress and conduct affect the learning atmosphere of the school. All staff members have the right and responsibility to uphold and enforce these rules. Student dress or grooming which is disruptive to the instructional process, or which creates risk of injury or harm to any student, is prohibited. The Board of Education declares that the following guidelines apply to all students who attend school and school activities in the West Covina Unified School District.

1. Attire as currently defined or designated as a group (Gang, Crew or Tagger) by the West Covina Police Department or School Administration is not permitted. Male students are not allowed to wear tank tops.
2. No undergarments shall be showing. Attire that is sexually suggestive or excessively brief, low cut, or revealing is not allowed. Examples: Clothing that is too tight (spandex), bare midriff, see-through tops.
3. Clothing or grooming that causes disruption or distraction among students within the classroom is not acceptable. Clothing should not be in disrepair. Examples: Clothing which advocates the use of controlled substances, violence, prejudice, or are sexually suggestive either through writing, pictures, or insignia.

4. Shoes or sandals must be worn at all times. The type of shoe must be hygienic, safely protect the foot and be appropriate during the activities the student engages in throughout the school day. For hygienic reasons socks with shoes or tennis shoes are recommended.
5. Jewelry and accessories shall not be worn which have the potential to be dangerous or can be used as a weapon or to indicate group (Gang, Tagger) affiliations. Example: chains, wrist bands with studs, bandanas.
6. Pants, shorts, skirts, and skorts will be worn at the waist, above the hip, and fit sufficiently so that a belt is not needed. Overalls must fit and the sides and straps need to be fastened. For safety reasons, outerwear such as jackets and sweaters must not be oversized. Shoulder straps on all shirts must a minimum of 2 inches wide.
7. Sun-protective clothing, including but not limited to hats, may be worn only outdoors during the school day. Knit hats/caps, bandanas, hairnets, shower caps, and "Do-Rags" are prohibited. Hats with bills or brims must be worn with the bill facing forward. Hats, caps, and other head coverings shall not be worn indoors in the classrooms or administration buildings. Only West Covina High School hats or beanies are allowed to be worn on or visible on campus. All other hats or beanies worn or seen on campus will be confiscated and held for parents to pick up.
8. PE type clothing such as sweats is appropriate for PE and not for regular school attire. Team warm-up outfits are acceptable on game and spirit days.
9. No sports jerseys other than West Covina High School team jerseys will be allowed on campus.
10. Student dress for social functions shall be determined by the sponsors of these functions and announced prior to the occasion.
11. Staff shall apply the dress standards consistently and equally to all students.

### **AR 5132 (B)**

The legislature expressed a number of concerns and beliefs:

The children of this state have the right to an effective public school education. Both students and staff on all campuses have a right to be safe and secure in their persons at school. There is too much focus on violence and messages of violence contained in many aspects of our society, particularly reflected in gang regalia, which can be disruptive to the learning environment. "Gang related apparel" is hazardous to the health and safety of the school environment. Instructing teachers and students in the subtleties of constantly changing gang regalia and affiliation takes time away from education.

- a) Clothing which is too large can conceal weapons, specifically jumpsuits and overcoats and/or large bags.
- b) The adoption of a school wide uniform policy is a reasonable way to provide some protection for students.
- c) To control the environment in the public schools to facilitate and maintain an effective learning environment and to keep the focus of the classroom on learning and not personal safety, schools need the authorization to implement uniform clothing requirements for our public school children.
- d) Many educators believe that school dress significantly influences pupil behavior. This influence is evident on school dress-up days and color days. Schools that have adopted school uniforms experience a coming together feeling, greater school pride and better behavior in and out of the classroom. Therefore:
  1. The Governing Board may adopt or rescind a reasonable dress code policy that requires pupils to wear a school-wide uniform or prohibits pupils from wearing "gang-related apparel" or clothing that is disruptive to the learning environment.
  2. Enforcement of a reasonable dress code is not a violation of the right of free speech.\*
  3. If a school uniform policy is established it must comply with all restrictions and the right to opt out of the uniform policy as established in ED. Code 35183.

### **AR 5132 (C)**

1. It is recognized that there will be some items of clothing that may be acceptable at the high school level that are not at the middle school or elementary. Specifics in each school's dress code may vary for that reason.
2. Violations of the dress code, resulting in a safety, health, or educational disruption problems will be addressed on an individual basis.

## **RULES FOR DANCES**

School Dances, Formal dances and Proms have always been popular at WCHS. Dances begin by 7:00PM and end by 11:00PM. Dances are sponsored by student organizations as fundraisers. **All School policies and rules are in full effect and enforced for dances.** Please note the following standards regarding dance activities:

- On-campus dances and Winter Formal are open to all WCHS students. Prom tickets are available for purchase by Juniors and Seniors only. Underclassmen are considered guests at Prom and must complete a guest pass.
- Students must purchase his/her own ticket under his/her own name with his/her current school ID card at the ASB windows at lunch. All dance attendees must complete a dance contract. All fines and truancies must be cleared first. **Only cash is accepted as payment.**
- Purchased tickets are **nontransferable** and **nonrefundable**.
- A WCHS student may bring only one guest. A Guest Pass must be completed with parent approval, the name and school attended by the guest, and the approval of the guest's school administrator and a WCHS administrator (or work location if not currently a high school or college student). A copy of the guest's current photo ID is also required. Guests must be under the age of 21.
- Guests must be accompanied by their sponsoring WCHS student to enter the dance.
- Guest passes are non-transferable.
- WCHS students and their guests must carry their current school ID card and carry a photo ID (for the guest). **An ID must be presented prior to admittance to the dance.** *WCHS staff reserves the right to deny admission to anyone.*
- **Tickets will not be sold at the door.**
- No student or guest will be admitted more than one hour past the dance's start time.
- Students and/or their guests may not leave the dance prior to the last half hour of the scheduled ending time of the dance when the dance is held on campus. Students and/or their guests may not leave the dance prior to the last hour of the scheduled ending time of the dance when the dance is held off campus.
- Students should be sure to have all items needed for the evening as they enter the dance. Students will not be able to go back to cars to retrieve items once admitted to the dance. There is no exit and re-entry at dances.
- Once a student leaves the dance he/she cannot return.
- All dance attendees may be subject to search upon entry. Items that might be confiscated include, but are not limited to: any liquid container, lanyards, gum, mint/candy containers, food.
- Any student or guest found to be in possession or under the influence of alcohol or drugs will be denied admission or removed from the dance and their parents will be called to pick them up. Law enforcement may be contacted. If the parent is unavailable, the student will be referred to the police department.
- Any student removed from a dance for the use or possession of alcohol, drugs, fighting, failure to follow directions of chaperones, or any other form of disrespect or inappropriate behavior may not be allowed to attend any school sponsored dance/event for the remainder of the year, and are subject to all school rules and discipline measures.
- Students are expected to DANCE appropriately. Lap dancing, freaking, and grinding have been determined inappropriate at WCHS dances.
- Dress Code will be strictly enforced. If a student is dressed inappropriately they will not be admitted to the dance or asked to change outfits before entering.

**Students must have a 2.0 total weighted grade point average with no F's or U's in the preceding semester, with consideration of disciplinary records at discretion of administration and possess a current ASB card prior to nomination to qualify for dance courts.**

## **EDUCATION CODE 48915(C)**

The principal, superintendent of school shall immediately suspend pursuant to section 48911, and shall recommend expulsion of a pupil that he or she determines has committed any of the following acts at school or at a school activity off school grounds to and/or from school:

1. Possessing, selling or otherwise furnishing a firearm. The subdivision does not apply to an act of possessing a firearm if the pupil has obtained prior written permission to possess the firearm from a certified school employee, which is concurred in by the principal or the designee of the principal. This subdivision applies to an act of possessing a firearm only if the possession is verified by an employee of a school district.

2. Brandishing a knife at another person.
3. Unlawfully selling a controlled substance listed in Chapter 2 (commencing with Section 11053) of Division 10 of the Health and Safety Code.
4. Committing or attempting to commit a sexual assault as defined in subdivision (n) of Section 48900 or committing a sexual battery as defined in subdivision (n) of Section 48900.
5. Possession of an explosive.

### **DISCIPLINE CODE**

Education Code Section 48900 indicates that those students who have violated any of the following may be subject to suspension and/or recommendation for expulsion from school. On occasion, however, the Saturday Work Program and/or community service will be assigned in lieu of a suspension.

- a.) Caused, attempted to cause, or threatened to cause physical injury to another person or; 2) Willfully used force or violence upon the person of another, except in self-defense.
- b.) Without authorization, possessed, sold, or otherwise furnished any firearm, knife, explosive, or other dangerous object.
- c.) Unlawfully possessed, used, sold, furnished, or was under the influence of a controlled substance, alcohol, or intoxicant.
- d.) Unlawfully offered, arranged, or negotiated to sell a controlled substance, alcohol, or other intoxicant, and then sold, delivered, or furnished something else instead, and represented it as a controlled substance, alcohol, or intoxicant.
- e.) Committed or attempted to commit robbery or extortion.
- f.) Caused or attempted to cause damage to school or private property.
- g.) Stole or attempted to steal school or private property.
- h.) Possessed or used tobacco, or any products containing tobacco or nicotine products, including, but not limited to, cigarettes, cigars, miniature cigars, clove cigarettes, smokeless tobacco, snuff and chew packets.
- i.) Committed an obscene act or engage in habitual profanity or vulgarity.
- j.) Unlawfully possessed, offered, arranged, or negotiated to sell drug paraphernalia.
- k.) Disrupted school activities or defied the authority of school personnel.
- l.) Knowingly received stolen school or private property.
- m.) Possessed an imitation firearm. An "imitation firearm" is a replica of a firearm that is so substantially similar in physical properties to an existing firearm as to lead a reasonable person to conclude that the replica is a firearm.
- n.) Committed or attempted to commit a sexual assault or battery.
- o.) Harassed, threatened or intimidated a pupil who is a complaining witness in a school disciplinary proceeding for the purpose of either preventing that pupil from being a witness or retaliating against that pupil for being a witness or both.
- p.) Unlawfully offered, arranged to sell, negotiated to sell, or sold the prescription drug Soma
- q.) Engaged in, or attempted to engage in, hazing as defined in subdivision (b) of Section 245.6 of the Penal Code
- s.) Aided or abetted the infliction or attempted infliction of physical injury to another person as defined by Penal Code Section 31
- t.) As used in this section, "school property" includes, but is not limited to, electronic files and databases.

Education Code: 48900.2: Pupil has committed sexual harassment.

Education Code: 48900.3: Caused, attempted to cause, threatened to cause, or participated in an act of hate violence.

Education Code: 48900.4: Intentionally engaged in harassment, threats, or intimidation, directed against a pupil or group of pupils that is sufficiently severe to have created a hostile educational environment.

Education Code 48900.7: Pupil made terroristic threats against school officials, or school property or both.

**These rules apply on any West Covina Unified School District campus - whether enrolled in that particular school or not - while going to or coming from school or any school-sponsored activity.**

Violation of civil or criminal codes will also include a referral to the local police department. Drug related offenses will result in suspension up to five days and a possible recommendation for expulsion from all schools of the West Covina Unified School District. Use or possession of alcohol could result in the same penalty.

For the offenses listed below, state law requires school and district personnel to examine the possibility of expulsion:

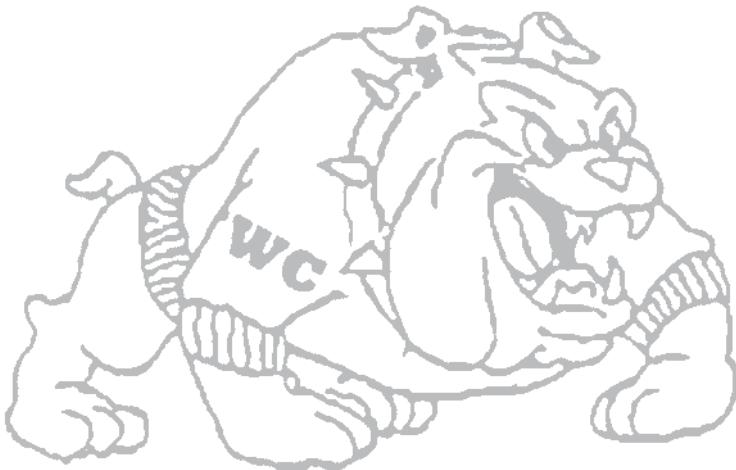
- a) Causing serious physical injury to another person, except in self-defense.
- b) Possession of any firearm, knife, explosive, or other dangerous object of no reasonable use to the pupil at school or at a school activity off school grounds.
- c) Unlawful possession of any controlled substance, as defined in Section 11053 of the Health and Safety Code, except for the sale or not more than one avoirdupois ounce of marijuana, other than concentrated cannabis.
- d) Robbery or extortion.
- e) Assault or battery upon a school employee

**Students are expected to follow the rules and regulations of the school, attend classes regularly, comply with laws and be respectful towards the authority. Violations could result in the following:**

- **Disciplinary conference and/or parent contact.**
- **Detention (up to one hour beyond the maximum school day.) Students are notified 24 hours in advance. It is their responsibility to notify their parents.**
- **Assign school or community service.**
  - **Saturday Work Program**
  - **Behavior contract or restitution where applicable.**
  - **Suspension; In-house or Home Suspension**
  - **School Attendance Review Team, School Attendance Review Board**
  - **Expulsion (from all district schools.)**

### **SEARCH AND SEIZURE**

School officials may search individual students and their property when there is a reasonable suspicion that the search will uncover evidence that the student is violating the law or the rules of the district or school. Discretion, good judgment, and common sense will be exercised in all cases of search and seizure.

**GROUNDS FOR SUSPENSION AND EXPULSION**  
**California Education Code Section 48900 et seq.**

A pupil shall not be suspended from school or recommended for expulsion unless the superintendent or the principal of the school in which the pupil is enrolled determines that the pupil has:

- (a) (1) Caused, attempted to cause, or threatened to cause physical injury to another person.  
(2) Willfully used force or violence upon the person of another, except in self-defense.
- (b) Possessed, sold, or otherwise furnished any firearm, knife, explosive, or other dangerous object unless, in the case of possession of any object of this type, the pupil had obtained written permission to possess the item from a certificated school employee, which is concurred in by the principal or the designee of the principal.
- (c) Unlawfully possessed, used, sold, or otherwise furnished, or been under the influence of any controlled substance listed in Chapter 2 (commencing with Section 11053) of Division 10 of the Health and Safety Code, an alcoholic beverage, or an intoxicant of any kind.
- (d) Unlawfully offered, arranged, or negotiated to sell any controlled substance listed in Chapter 2 (commencing with Section 11053) of Division 10 of the Health and Safety Code, an alcoholic beverage, or an intoxicant of any kind, and then either sold, delivered, or otherwise furnished to any person another liquid, substance, or material and represented the liquid, substance, or material as a controlled substance, alcoholic beverage, or intoxicant.
- (e) Committed or attempted to commit robbery or extortion.
- (f) Caused or attempted to cause damage to school property or private property.
- (g) Stolen or attempted to steal school property or private property.
- (h) Possessed or used tobacco, or any products containing tobacco or nicotine products, including, but not limited to, cigarettes, cigars, miniature cigars, clove cigarettes, smokeless tobacco, snuff, chew packets, and betel. However, this section does not prohibit use or possession by a pupil of his or her own prescription products.
- (i) Committed an obscene act or engaged in habitual profanity or vulgarity.
- (j) Unlawfully possessed or unlawfully offered, arranged, or negotiated to sell any drug paraphernalia, as defined in Section 11014.5 of the Health and Safety Code.
- (k) Disrupted school activities or otherwise willfully defied the valid authority of supervisors, teachers, administrators, school officials, or other school personnel engaged in the performance of their duties.
- (l) Knowingly received stolen school property or private property.
- (m) Possessed an imitation firearm.
- (n) Committed or attempted to commit a sexual assault or committed a sexual battery.
- (o) Harassed, threatened, or intimidated a pupil who is a complaining witness or a witness in a school disciplinary proceeding for the purpose of either preventing that pupil from being a witness or retaliating against that pupil for being a witness, or both.
- (p) Unlawfully offered, arranged to sell, negotiated to sell, or sold the prescription drug Soma.
- (q) Engaged in, or attempted to engage in, hazing as defined in Section 32050.
- (r) Engaged in an act of bullying, including, but not limited to, bullying committed by means of an electronic act directed specifically toward a pupil or school personnel.
- (t) Aided or abetted the infliction or attempted infliction of physical injury to another person (suspension only).

48900.2 Committed sexual harassment (grades 4-12).

48900.3 Caused, attempted to cause, threatened to cause, or participated in an act of hate violence (grades 4-12).

48900.4 Intentionally engaged in harassment, threats, or intimidation, directed against school district personnel or pupils. (grades 4-12).

48900.7 Made terroristic threats against school officials or school property, or both.

It is the intent of the Legislature that alternatives to suspension or expulsion be imposed against any pupil who is truant, tardy, or otherwise absent from school activities. (48900[w])

- (e) Cometió o intentó cometer robo o extorsión.
- (f) Causó o intentó causar daño a la propiedad escolar o propiedad privada.
- (g) Robó o intentó robar propiedad escolar o propiedad privada.
